## New Physician - Dr. Nabeel Manzar



I come from a family of doctors. My father was a surgeon. My sister is an internist and my brother-in-law is also a family physician.

I graduated from Dow Medical College, Dow University of Health Sciences in 2011. Dow Medical College is one of the oldest and one of the most prestigious medical colleges in Pakistan providing quality medical education. Most of Pakistani doctors here in US are from there. I was a meritorious student and on scholarship throughout my education years. I was already working in Pakistan in Pediatrics before I came to Brooklyn Hospital Center where I did my residency. Post-residency I interviewed at many places, including at Mayo and was offered a job there. There I met some people from Dickinson and they

offered me to come and visit Sanford and the rest is history. I am currently working at Sanford West Dickinson Clinic in Dickinson and also provide outreach to Watford City. I am also associated with UND as Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics and regularly teach medical students from UND and Des Moines University Iowa.

The reason I was drawn to Dickinson was small town feel of the community. I immediately felt at home. Everybody was so welcoming and warm. I also developed excellent rapport with my fellow colleagues in practice namely; Dr. Oksa and Dr. Ricks.

I am strongly drawn to academic work as well. I was assistant editor Journal College of Surgeons and Physicians Pakistan. The only Journal in Pakistan indexed in PubMed and has an impact factor. I have more than 20 publications in national and international peer reviewed medical publications. I have presented regularly at international and national meetings of medical societies. I have worked on boards of many journals as reviewer and as guest editor.

Outside of work I enjoy the outdoors. Hiking, biking, reading, listening to good music and going out for movies. My idea of care is "Preventative care to keep children of all ages healthy." My interests in Pediatrics are: obesity, asthma, allergy, special needs kids, and ADHD. I have been strongly associated with AAP and was a delegate for AAP throughout my three years of residency.
