## Characteristic s of Care Coordination, from the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP)

- Patient and Family-Centered
- Proactive, planned \& comprehensive
- Promotesself-care, skills and independence
- Emphasizes cross-organizational relationships



## What Do We Sta rt With First?

What families want depends on the difference between the support they already have and what they will need given their situation.



## North Dakota Medicaid

- Low-income individuals from birth
- Children in foster care or subsidized adoption
- Former foster care children up to age 26, under certa in circumstances
- Children with disabilities (birth to 19 )
- Pregnant women
- Women with breast orcervical cancer
- Workers with disabilities
- Other blind and disabled individuals
- Low-income Medicare beneficiaries (Medicare Savings Programs)
- Waivers


## ND Waivers/Programs

- Autism Spectrum Disorder Waiver
- Provides services for young children birth to age 12 who have an autism spectrum disorder diagnosis
- Children with Disabilities Medicaid Coverage (Medicaid Buy In)
- Allows qua lifying children with disabilities to buy into Medicaid. The program provides comprehensive coverage through Medicaid, including dental and mental health coverage, in retum for a premium. This requires eligibility at 200\% Federal Poverty Level.
- Children's Hospic e Wa iver
- Provides support to fa milies so they can care for their children (birth through age 21) in their homes aslong as possible, a voiding lengthy hospital stays and a voiding institutionalized care


## ND Waivers Continued...

- Children with Medic a lly Fragile Needs Medicaid Waiver
- Assists qualifying medic a lly fragile child ren between ages 3 a nd 18. The child needs to be living at home, be Medicaid eligible, be able to meet the Level of Care c riteria for a nursing home and meet criteria based on the Level of Need.
- Intellectual Disabilities/ Developmental Disa bilitiesWa iver(DD Wa iver)
- Assists eligible individuals with intellectual disa bilities and developmental disabilities to remain living at home and in the community. The waiver serves individuals through the lifespan (both children and a dults).



## Travel Issues

## - In State Travel

- As of December 31, 2016, the waivers no longer offer a ssista nce with tra vel to fa milies, as this is a vaila ble to Medicaid recipients through the Medic aid state plan
- Fa milies need to work with their local county social service office, who can assist them in finding a travel provider enrolled in ND Medicaid prior to appointments
- Fa milies cannot be directly reimbursed for travel, unless a family member is an enrolled provider
- Transportation providers are reimbursed at the ND state rate

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## Out of State Travel

- Always requires prior a pproval (SFN 769)
- Ensure the patient receives the letter of a pproval before the trip/appointment occurs (PCP may receive a pproval prior to fa mily)
- Fa milies need to work with their local county social service office, to assist them in finding a travel provider enrolled with ND Medic aid prior to out of state travel
- In an effort to alleviate some of the problems faced by children with special health care needs and access to specialty care, in 2012 the state Medicaid office and their Pediatric Task Force developed SFN 606.
- This form a ccompanies the standard out-of-state approval request


## More About the Medic aid Out of State Servic es Certific ation Form (SFN 606)

- Necessary services(referenced on the SFN 769) are not available for this child for the following reasons (select all that apply and explain):
- To ensure continuity of care, and if the in-state refeming providerhas determined that the follow up should be provided at the facility that performed the surgery or services; a follow up to a previously a pproved and performed out-of-state surgery or specialty service
- A set of related inter-depended servicesfordia gnosis a nd treatment are needed and the entire set of services is not available in-state
- After the in-state refeming provider consults with the in-state specialist, it is determined that the wait time for in-state spec ialty services is expected to negatively impact the diagnosis or treatment
- Only one in-state specialist is available to provide the service; however, adverse previous client or refeming provider experience with the specia list substantiates the need to seek servic es out-of-state



## ND Health Tracks

## Deta ils a bout EPSDT

- Forindividualsunder age 21
- Assures these individuals achieve a physic al and mental level of wellness
- Providescare, treatment, and other corrective health measures as necessary
- Visits with ND Health Tracks utilizes the Bright Futures Guidelines (www.brightfutures.org)
- Health care must be made available for treatment or other measures to correct or ameliorate defects and physical and mental illnesses or conditions discovered by the screening services


## Developmental Screening \& Early Intervention

- Right Track Program
- Consultants can meet with families in the privacy of their own home and will provide free developmental screenings up to age 3
- Infant Development Program (Ea ly Intervention)
- This program is designed to identify children at risk in the earliest stages, when the right help can make all the difference. It is for any child under the age of three who is suspected of having a delay or who hasa medic al condition that could result in a developmental delay or disability

## General SHS

## Eligibility

- Age - child must be birth to age 21 years
- Residency - child must be a ND resident

Special Health Care Need - child must have a chronic condition and require health and related services beyond that needed by most children


- Financial eligibility for treatment services is $185 \%$ of the FPL
- Families must use qualified providers that participate in the SHS program

- Early and Continuous Screening and Surveillance (including Fetal Alc ohol Syndrome-FAS)

- Supports children whom are Deaf or Hard of Hearing by providing these fa milies with the resources, networks, and information they need to improve communic ation access a nd educ a tional outc omes for their child ren


## Fa mily Support Programs: Children with Special Health Care Needs

- Project Carson
- Offers support to new parents who receive a prenatal orat birth diagnosis
- Fa mily Voic es of ND
- As the statewide health information and education center for families who have children with a special health need ordisability, they do some of the following:
- Navigate public and private systems, listen to families and guide them to solutions, promote family-centered care and medical homes, provide technic al assistance and workshops


## Fa mily Sup port Programs cont.

- Supplemental Sec urity Income (SSI) - is a Federal income supplement program funded by general tax revenues (not Social Sec unity taxes)
- Pathfinders - Assist North Dakota families of child ren and youth with leaming difficulties
- Experienced Parent Program - Pathfinder Services of ND was awarded the Experienced Parents Program NDDHS Developmental Disa bilities Division. This program is for families receiving Early Intervention Services while working in collaboration with Early Intervention professionals
- Federation of Fa milies - ND Federation of Fa miliesfor Children's Mental Health is a parent-run organization focused on the needs of children and youth with emotional, behavioral or mental disorders a nd their families
